Most cherished dreams of Filipino parents

- 78%-Improve family welfare
 - Provide better future
 - Have happy, quiet family life
 - See children finish schooling
 - Longer life, better health for family
 - Be a good spouse/parent/child
- 16%-Help the poor, the church, the country

But there is A world of Difference between Dreams and Reality



Problems

- The basic problems of the Philippines is poverty:
 - High population growth rate, not enough employment
 - 60% of the population are young (0-24 years of age) dependent on parental support
 - 25% of people earn only US\$2 or less a day

No. 1 Goal: Save the children

- 1. 35 out of 1,000 children born will not live to celebrate their first birthday
- 2. 50 out of 1,000 births will not reach their 5th birthday



REASONS WHY

Their mothers' poor health

- because mothers were too young to bear children
- or gave birth too often or were sickly and malnourished in childhood and so their offspring will carry the consequences

Malnourished

 3 out of 5 Filipino children are malnourished. Children up to 3 years of age are vulnerable to malnutrition.

The Working Children



While 97 % of children enter elementary school-1/3 drop out before 4th grade because of poverty.

3 out of 20 children or 3.7 million are working children

-of this number 2/3 are farm workers

-60% are exposed to cruel and hazardous working conditions

The Street children

Children in conflict with the law

-Usually male, ages
14-17
-From low income
family
-Exposed to drugs
and gang influence
-Charged with
robbery and Theft



The number of street children is increasing at 10% per year as jobless migrants flock to the cities looking for employment.

Without parental support or guidance street children are left to exploitation by lawless elements

Girl-Children

Girls are usually disadvantaged in education, child labor, prostitution, cultural biases and socialization

96% of child abuse cases are girls.

Almost all sex abuse victims are girls

No 2 Goal: Save the Mother



172 out of 100,000 mothers die while giving birth

- -Lack of access to reproductive health care and education.
- -Teenage pregnancies pose high risk to both mother and child.
- -Maternal malnutrition is major factor affecting unborn child's survival and fetal development.

6 out of 10 Filipino women are battered by their husbands or partners



- Kris Aquino is a daughter of a national hero and the first lady president of the Philippines
- By herself she has been a successful actress and popular TV personality

But she also became a victim of domestic violence

Goal 3: Save the Family

- Over 5 million Filipinos work overseas. For better work and bigger pay. But while they're gone they leave behind a home and children without parents.
- Among the poor, men's violence towards women are legitimized because of the culture of linking Masculinity with toughness, male honor and male dominance. The role of women are generally rigidly defined and enforced.

Proposals are pilot projects aimed to meet these goals- providing a formula for clubs in the district to follow.

- Porta Day Care Centers for pre-schoolers from the poor communities
- Reproductive Health Clinics in poor communities so there are less infant and maternal deaths
- Training of Reproductive Health Workers to provide support and reduce violence against women.
- Livelihood to empower women so they can upgrade their status within their family and their community
